### **Student Comments**

Below are *unedited* qualitative student evaluations for courses that I have taught at four institutions: University of Nottingham, Queens University, Fordham University, and the University of Cambridge.

I have bolded comments that I feel bring out my strengths as an instructor. I am happy to provide full sets of evaluations from all classes I have taught.

<u>Note</u>: I have no student evaluations for my "Knowledge & Justification" class for two reasons: first, the survey for my Spring 2019 class was not created due to an administrative error, so no data was collected; second, the survey was suspended in Spring 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, so no data was collected that term.



# PHIL 3028 – Knowledge, Ignorance, and Democracy (Spring 2020)

This is the most engaging, relevant and thought-provoking module of my university experience (across three schools), despite hindered engagement from remote learning. Thank you very much for you continued effort to keep it so!

This has been my favourite module so far at university.

Michael is an **amazing teacher**. He has a very slow, clear way of teaching and he is **very approachable**. **Always happy to help** and you never feel rushed when chatting to him in 1 2 1's. One of the better teachers i have had at UoN and i specifically take my modules as i know i like his teaching style. I always find it more enjoyable when a teacher lets their opinions, thoughts and passions shine through when teaching modules and he did throughout this module.

I am really interested in the topic of fake news and I know we haven't come to that bit yet but I would prefer if the material edged more towards those kind of subjects (just a personal preference)

Really interesting content that feels less like 'analytical' philosophy (more sociology and psychology thrown into discussions about epistemology). Also, the content is very topically relevant in society today.

The concepts are very well explained, in an accessible format, videos are well-recorded, informative, engaging.

The interesting discussions about the role that truth has in politics and how this can be used as power.

Interesting topics every week. I don't think there is too much reading as others have suggested. I know students at other universities in first and second year who have far more reading for their

philosophy modules. I think there is a very reasonable level of reading required given our total contact hours.

I like most that the module is so relatable and visible in the real world. It makes you think about both the deeper and the ordinary things in a different way.

Pleasantly surprised by how unbiased and objective discussions are. Surprisingly not a given when discussing politics at universities.

The recorded lectures are content heavy yet enjoyable and easy to take in which makes them feel worthwhile

Interesting readings, made me think about politics in a completely different way (in a good way!)

so relevant to current climate, so very topical. also feel as though i can engage with political activism more readily with the information i now have

The topic is **incredibly interesting**. I find that the hour seminar is not enough to get though questions and discussions on the content on both the seminar and the lecture.

I have really enjoyed this module, and I think it has covered political epistemology in a way that feels very relevant to our times. Have covered lots of new topics and the seminars are always interesting.

A **very engaging** and increasingly relevant module, further 'lecture engagement' sessions could be helpful for breaking down any issues with lecture material in order to keep seminar discussion well informed. However this is primarily an issue due to online learning.

Loved learning about events and things in modern politics as I am very interested in it, great to learn about it in academic way.

I found this module **really interesting and thought provoking**. Even though this module didn't include lecture engagements I think the amount of teaching and discussion were enough to help me understand and enage with the content. Another thing I really appreciated were the module convenors feedback on essay plans because it was constructive and asked questions I had not thought of which really pushed me further into content for my essays.

Have found this module really engaging, its definitely changed how I think about politics!

I think this module is **one of my favourites of my whole degree**. I think the topics that have been discussed are incredibly relevant to the world right now, especially things like fake news, failures in deliberation and echo chambers. Could not recommend this module enough to others who were choosing their third year modules. Michael is a **thoughtful and excellent lecturer**.

This has been the most interested I have been in a module at University, seminars have been well run with a great balance between Michael teaching and students engaging.

## PHIL 2000 - Why Be Good? An Introduction to Ethics

This professor was one of the BEST professors I have had in my years at college. He's intelligent and encourages discussion while giving great insight on very complex topics.

One of my favorite teachers so far. Class discussions, handouts, and PowerPoints were extremely helpful. It helps a lot that the professor seems to genuinely care about the topic and it is evident he is extremely knowledgeable.

I cannot think of anything that would improve this course. He's got it down.

Michael Hannon is a great teacher. He is funny and able to hold the attention of the class while still teaching the material that is required. I wish that I were taking more philosophy classes so that I could have him as a teacher again. He's a keeper!

It made a huge impact that the professor was **approachable** and it was apparent that he was extremely knowledgeable. He did a great job of explaining and relating the readings to other class readings and real life. Also, class discussion helped increase my understanding and interest in the class.

Professor brought guests to class to elaborate on the subject, which I found positive to learn ideas from others.

Professor Hannon took the time to explain his direction, and acknowledge each side of the issues posed in readings. He is very objective and encourages meaningful class discussion.

The structure of the class was very organized in that the paired readings worked well together in displaying contrasting ideas that argue each other nicely. Also, his lectures helped place the assigned readings in a broader context.

As overwhelming of a subject that Why Be Good? An Introduction to Ethics may seem, Hannon did an awesome job of keeping everything straightforward and clear.
